Dick Twitchell and Betty Proctor attended the HLAA convention session on emergency preparedness. The September 15 meeting guest speaker (TBA) will discuss what we should know, what we should have and what to do when an emergency happens. Remember that having hearing loss presents other obstacles.

Lisa Hamlin who is public policy director at HLAA presented the session and one of the things she told us is that in May 2014, texting to 911 in emergencies will become available. She also shared that the Red Cross has a "Safe & Well Listings" program where you can register yourself so

- Glow sticks
- Copies of important papers
- Cash (ATMs may not work)
- Medications info (keep a week's worth ready and rotate out in med containers to keep fresh)
- Small white board & marker, pen or pencil & pad of paper for communication
- Current list of meds, allergies, doctors
- Medical ID bracelet
