As we continue to advocate for ourselves, we also must be the voice for HOH children who need our guidance and assistance.



# **Hearing aid warranties**

If you have purchased hearing aids, you already know that it is a sizeable financial commitment, but what about after you walk out the door? What is covered?

When I bought my hearing aids in summer 2012, they came with a 2-year manufacturer warranty, covering everything. I recently had to use it when one of my aids went from low to high sound and I was unable to get it adjusted right somewhere in the middle. "Components" were replaced and voila, I'm good. No charge, even better.

Typically, warranties cover a year of damage, loss and repairs, but it is possible to get extended warranties for 2-3 years. I know of one audiologist who offers 4 years! # HLAA National now offers Webinars! Webcast on Hearing Loss and Healthy Aging - Jan. 13-14

The National Academies (Institute of Medicine and National Research Council) is pleased to announce a workshop to be held on "Hearing Loss and Healthy Aging" on January 13-14, 2014 in Washington, DC. This workshop will examine the ways in which age-related hearing loss affects healthy aging, and how the spectrum of public and private stakeholders can work together to address hearing loss in older adults as a public health issue.

Some of the topics to be covered in this workshop include the public health significance of hearing loss, the connection between hearing loss and healthy aging, hearing health care models, innovative hearing technologies, and short- and long-term collaborative strategies for approaching age-related hearing loss as a public health priority.

The webcast is FREE and open to the public, but registration is required. Registration for the webcast is available at the project website: www.iom.edu/hearingloss-aging.
